Leadership Training Programme

16.02.2017 - 18.02.2017

Education has long stressed the importance of rapport between teacher and students. The importance of recognizing and nurturing the diverse talents and abilities in each class and the important role teachers play in helping the students clarify and achieve their personal goals in life are the primary expectations of a teacher. In short teachers have always been leaders. Therefore, it is very important that teachers tune their leadership skills. The recent trends in the society demand a special training to equip the teachers and to develop the leadership skills in them. The college organized two different training programmes for two different target groups

- the teaching staff and
- the administrative staff

The Programme was divided into two Stages. Stage 1: Consultancy with the Senior Administrators - Stage 2: Training programme for the young administrators of the Colleges of Education in India. The participants were invited from colleges of education.

STAGE I: Consultation with the Senior Administrators of Colleges in India to design the training programme was conducted on 7-10-2016

One-day consultation with the Senior Administrators was conducted. 5 Senior Administrators from Colleges in India were invited. They were

- Fr. Xavier Alphonse Former Principal, Loyola College, Chennai.
- Dr. Paul Appasamy, Former Vice-Chancellor, Karunya University, Coimbatore.
- Dr. M.Spurgeon Programme Officer UBCHEA, South Asia.
- Dr. P. Nithila Devakarunyam Principal, St. Christopher's College of Education, Chennai.

During the consultation the Senior Administrators team explored the Strategic Elements of Leadership and at the end of the consultation the senior administrators were able to

- Assess the Key Positions.
- Identify the areas where our leaders need training.
- Explored the leadership requirement of the New Millennium Colleges of Education.
- Generated the Leadership Development Plans, the ways to Monitor & Review.

STAGE 2: Training Programme for the young Administrators of Colleges in India was conducted from 16-02-2017 to 18-02-2017.

- The Programme was conducted for three days.
- During the Training Programme each day 8 hours were allotted for class room activities, for concept clarification and learning. Each day 2 hours were set aside for practical class. The participants were exposed to Leadership skills. The Schedule sketched in the Stage 1 of the Programme was followed for Stage 2 training programme.
- The Experts in the field who have been in the leadership position for nearly a decade were invited as the Resource Persons.
- Invitations were sent to Colleges throughout India. 47 administrators from colleges participated in the training programme.
- In the Leadership Training, insights were given on the sub themes like Leadership in general, understanding others, Communication Skills, Problem Solving, Stress, Time and conflict management, Motivation and Goal Setting, Minority Rights, Financial Management, Leadership and Challenges in Leadership which enabled the young administrators to identify the traits and skills of an effective leader.
- At the end of the programme, from the feedback of the participants, it was understood that the participants were enlightened by the various thoughts of experts throughout this programme and were equipped well enough to develop a plan to build up ones' own leadership potential.

Conclusion:

The Leadership programme conducted created awareness among the participants about different leadership styles. The participants have understood about Leadership in general, need of Communication Skills, how to Understand others, Solve the Problem, ways to handle Stress, Time and conflict issues, how to be motivated and to motivate others, Goal Setting, areas in Minority Rights, Financial Management, essential need of Leadership and the Challenges in Leadership. The activities facilitated the participants to examine the role, duties and responsibilities of a Leader in the workplace. This will also help them in planning their work and executing them according to the plan.
